Philippines Kids EE clinic

In the Philippines we partner with Pastor NONO Badoy. He is the newly appointed director of Kids and Youth EE for Asia and the Middle East.

The 10/40 Window

Pastor NONO's area of responsibility includes two thirds of the world's population. In these areas more than on half of the population is fourteen and under. This area includes much of the 10/40 window, where the vast majority of the unreached people groups of the world live.

In April Don was in Mindano, Philippines with Pastor NONO doing another Kids EE clinic for 55 adult leaders, a a third of which came from Muslim controlled areas. One of the clinicians from this clinic is currently en route to a middle eastern country to begin preparations for the very first Kids EE clinic in the entire Middle East.

Our Entire Life Savings!

Pastor NoNo's family spent their entire life savings to go to India and teach the very first Kids EE clinic as a family. Their car was breaking down and they needed a new one. The choice was to buy a new car, or go do the clinic. Nono laid the choice before his family. The boys said, "Dad, we need to do this!" and so off to India for India's first two clinics.

While Don returned to the US for a clinic in Ft. Lauderdale Pastor NONO was undertaking a huge project where 150 Kids from 5 Kids EE Implementing Churches from 3 Cities worked together to present the Kids EE Musical. Their EE teams were responsible for the follow-up for those they have invited. The Musical aimed to promote the EE ministry and encourage newcomers to enlist in one of our trainings.

Don and Suzy want to partner with Pastor NONO to reach the unreached people of the world in this 10/40 window. That begins with raising funds for the new clinician heading to the Middle East where we will need about \$4,000 for airfare, clinic materials, and materials to leave behind for implementation. We hope that you will pray for us and that the Lord will give us those with the vision to partner with us for this exciting opportunity.

What we don't do

Many people have the misconception that we go around the world and merely train children; but that is not the case.

What we do

We go around the world including Haiti, Jamaica, Belize, Ukraine, Indonesia, Philippines, Taiwan, Finland, Slovenia, Albania, Uganda, Nigeria, Southern Sudan, Kenya or any where we are invited by a local church. We train adults, who go back to their churches and recruit and train, other adults and youth who will train children .

Many churches around the world start by planning a strong children's ministry first knowing that parents will come where their kids are cared for and well.taught. When you meet the spiritual needs of children in your community your church will grow through the children's ministry.

Multiplication

The multiplication works in Kids EE the same as in Evangelism Explosion, but faster. This is how it works: we train an adult leader who in turn goes home to their church and they recruit and train ten or twenty leaders of children. Those leaders in turn each train two children. The training of the children, in essence, is a bi-product, yet each of those children become team leaders after a semester and train two more children.

We train adults at clinics, who come to learn Kids EE and then go back and implement it at their local church. In order to do that, they need to recruit many leaders for the kids who will come. These new leaders sit together with the children, while the one trained at the clinic, teaches. The trainers and kids are learning together.

When they go out on OJT there are adults, youth and kids going together in team, because obviously, kids don't go alone. It becomes an intergenerational family model of EE. It's a wonderful investment in the future. In just a few short years these same children will be in youth EE and then adult EE, while those adults who are trained continue for continuing semesters of Kids EE.

The three year plan

I'm on a mission to work myself out of a job. The first year I go in and teach a selected group adult leaders. The second year I go in and identify who God is raising up. Faithful servants who have been fruitful in my absence. They then co-teach with me the second year. The third year I go in and assist them and observe and equip them to carry on without me. And there I am, without a job and I move on to the next area. Praise God!
